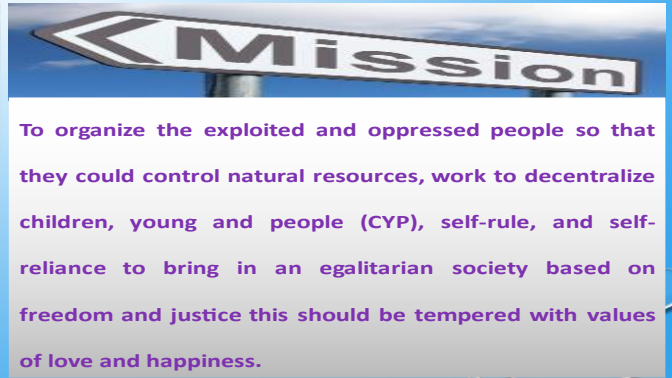

ABOUT THE ORGANISATION

Samarpan is as a campaign launched to bring the children & adolescents involved in the illegal mica mines of Koderma into the mainstream of education by freeing them. Some of us young friends started it together. Since then, Samarpan has continued to drive initiatives towards capacity building, fostering partnerships, livelihood promotion, ensuring entitlements, water conservation, and making a lasting impact on the health and rights of marginalized people.

At that time in our mica mines area, most of the children were malnourished had several health issues, and were not attending school. In order to educate the children, Samarpan started A Child Rights Awareness campaign in the Mica Mines area of Koderma District. At that time, Samarpan's main aim was only to ensure child rights through a strengthened community. Now, Samarpan's initiatives address issues related to Child rights, Women's empowerment, Livelihood promotion, Water Conservation, Education, Health, Nutrition, and Social Security.

Samarpan believes in Indigenocracy self-governance (Gram Sabha) self-dignity, and freedom with the equal and active participation of women, youth, and excluded communities. Also, the expansion of joyful life to every human being with the conservation and preservation of Natural and Cultural heritage.

Samarpan is a Hindi word that means Devotion, Dedication, and Commitment. Our services are for those who are backward and deprived of basic needs for their lives i.e., Sustainable livelihood Education, Health, Social Security Schemes, and Water. We extend our service to strengthen the love, respect, and rights of needy people to connect them with the development and mainstreaming of the community through participatory approaches.

After a continuous struggle, Samarpan's work these days expanded to other areas of Jharkhand and UP. We are working with the support of PHF, TDH, TDH Foundation, RMI, CIF, Welspun Foundation, Nabard, MWCD, and Govt. of Jharkhand.

Enhancing Livelihood and Nutritional Status through Agriculture and Water Conservation.

Objective:

- Address malnutrition through kitchen gardens & poultry.
- Revive natural sources of water & create a water-conservation structure.
- Income generation through livestock, small business & producing products from bamboo and leaves.
- Capacity building of community by experts in water conservation, agriculture & livestock development, and assisting people in linking up with government programs.

Right to survival - securing health, nutrition and education for children and safeguarding them from the harms of illegal mining in Koderma Districts.

Objective:

- All children in the age group 0-5 years in the project area are receiving health services, quality supplementary nutrition and pre-school education.
- All children in older age groups - 6-14 years and 15-17 years are attending primary and secondary school respectively and no child is engaged in mica collecting.
- State & District level stakeholders acknowledge the shortcomings in the delivery of government services and commit to improving the situation in areas of health & nutrition, education, and poverty alleviation measures

Community Empowerment Project-2

Objective:

- Increased income of MICA and NON - MICA households in 10 Villages of Koderma.
- Health and nutritional status of women and children in the community.
- Access to socio-economic entitlements has improved for MICA and NON-MICA households in 10 Villages of Koderma.
- Children of MICA engaged families' access to quality formal education in the age group 6 - 14 years.

CHILDLINE-1098

- CHILDLINE is a project of the Ministry of Women and Child Development. CHILDLINE toll-free 1098 is India's first 24-hour free emergency phone service for children in need, care and protection. Any concerned adult or a child in need for help, may dial 1098, the toll-free number to access our services. CHILDLINE is not only responding in an emergency but also linking them to services for their long-term care and rehabilitation.
- The goal of the CHILDLINE is to form a child-friendly nation where children are looked upon for their future and every child has ensured his/her right to enjoy their childhood.
- *Samarpan* has been working since 2016 as a Collab organization along with one sub-center NGO partner RJSS at Satgawan Block in Koderma district.

Awareness campaign on govt. Policies, programs, and schemes through Nukkad Natak and other events.

Area of Intervention: Koderma, Chatra, Hazaribagh & Saraykela-Kharsawan District of Jharkhand

Due to a lack of awareness most people in the urban and rural areas of Jharkhand cannot avail the facilities of Govt. schemes. In this context, our organization has two Nukad Natak teams which have been organizing Nukkad Natak, Geet-Sangeet, Seminar, Symposium, etc. to inform the community of government development schemes. They go to villages and aware communities regarding Government

schemes and also give messages regarding blind faith and social evils by singing Lokgeet, Mimicary and Nukad Natak. This is a very effective way to make the community aware and we find positive results.

Livelihood & Enterprise Development Program (LEDP)

Area of Intervention -Three Panchayats (Naitand, Beko & Dandadih of Jainagar Block

As skill upgradation trainings alone have limited impact on livelihood creation among the SHG members, it was thought prudent to create sustainable livelihoods among SHG members and to attain optimum benefit out of skill upgradation and a new scheme titled Livelihood and Enterprise Development Programme (LEDP). It envisages the conduct of livelihood promotion programmes in clusters.

There is provision for intensive training for skill building, refresher training, backward-forward linkages, and handholding & escort supports. It also encompasses the complete value chain and offers end-to-end solutions to the SHG members. It is to be implemented on a project basis covering 15 to 30 SHGs in a cluster of contiguous villages where SHG members have been selected.

The skill upgradation training is being imparted in batches of 25-30 members covering agriculture and allied activities as well as activities in the rural non-farm sector. LEDP not only helps in promoting sustainable livelihoods but also brings full benefits from promotional support and assistance. NABARD provides grant support for skill upgradation programs, the establishment of demonstration units, and need-based critical infrastructure.

National Campaign & Case Intervention of Domestic Violence.

Objective:

- Provide legal support and ensure human rights.
- It's a feminist organization ensure all legal perspectives related to women welfare.
- Ensure child rights and protect them against violations.
- Identify domestic violence and sexual harassment and provide legal support to the survivor.
- Help women for their social and financial rights.

Swadhar Greh

Samarpan is being run Successfully a Swadhar Greh at Hazaribagh with the support of Women and Child Development. Here, Institutional assistance is given for the rehabilitation of women victims of difficult circumstances. So that they can live their life with dignity. Under this scheme, economic and social security is being provided to these women along with shelter, food, clothing and health.

Swadhar has a total capacity of 30 women with the following objectives:

- To cater to the primary need of shelter, food, clothing, medical treatment and care of the women in distress and who are without any social and economic support.
- To enable them to regain their emotional strength that gets hampered due to their encounter with unfortunate circumstances.
- To provide them with legal aid and guidance to enable them to take steps for their readjustment in family/society.
- To rehabilitate them economically and emotionally.
- To act as a support system that understands and meets various requirements of women in distress.
- To enable them to start their life afresh with dignity and conviction.

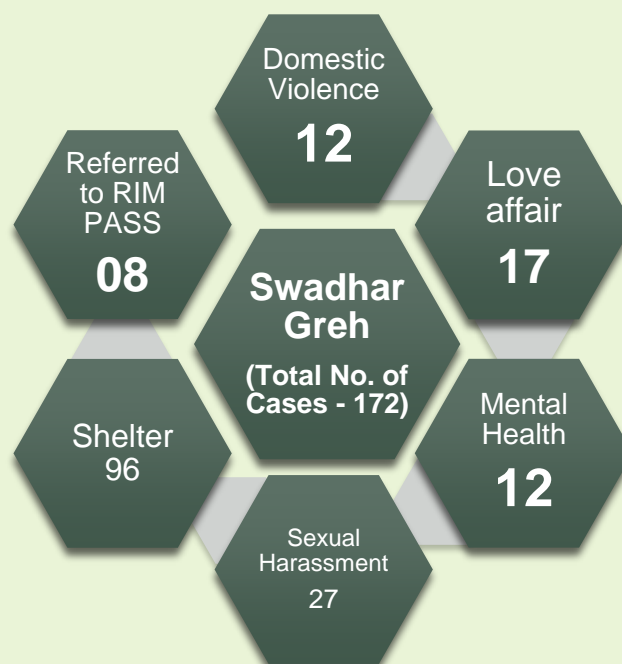
Strategies

The objectives cited above would be pursued adopting the following strategies:

- Temporary residential accommodation with the provision of food, clothing, medical facilities etc.
- Vocational and skill up gradation trainings for economic rehabilitation of such women
- Counselling, awareness generation and behavioural trainings
- Legal aid and Guidance
- Counselling through telephone

Beneficiaries

This year, a total of 172 cases were reported in Swadhar and they were given proper benefits.



Ujjawala Scheme/Home

Trafficked women/girls rescued or runaway from brothels or other places where they face exploitation and Women affected by HIV/AIDS who do not have any social or economic support. However, such women/ girls is being given the assistance under UJJAWALA Scheme in Hazaribagh, Jharkhand.

Here, Women affected by domestic violence is stay up to one year. For other categories of women, the maximum period of stay could be up to 3 years. The older women above the 55 years of age are accommodated for a maximum period of 5 years after which they have shift to old age homes or similar institutions.

A total of 164 cases were intervened directly and 65 cases indirectly this year.
