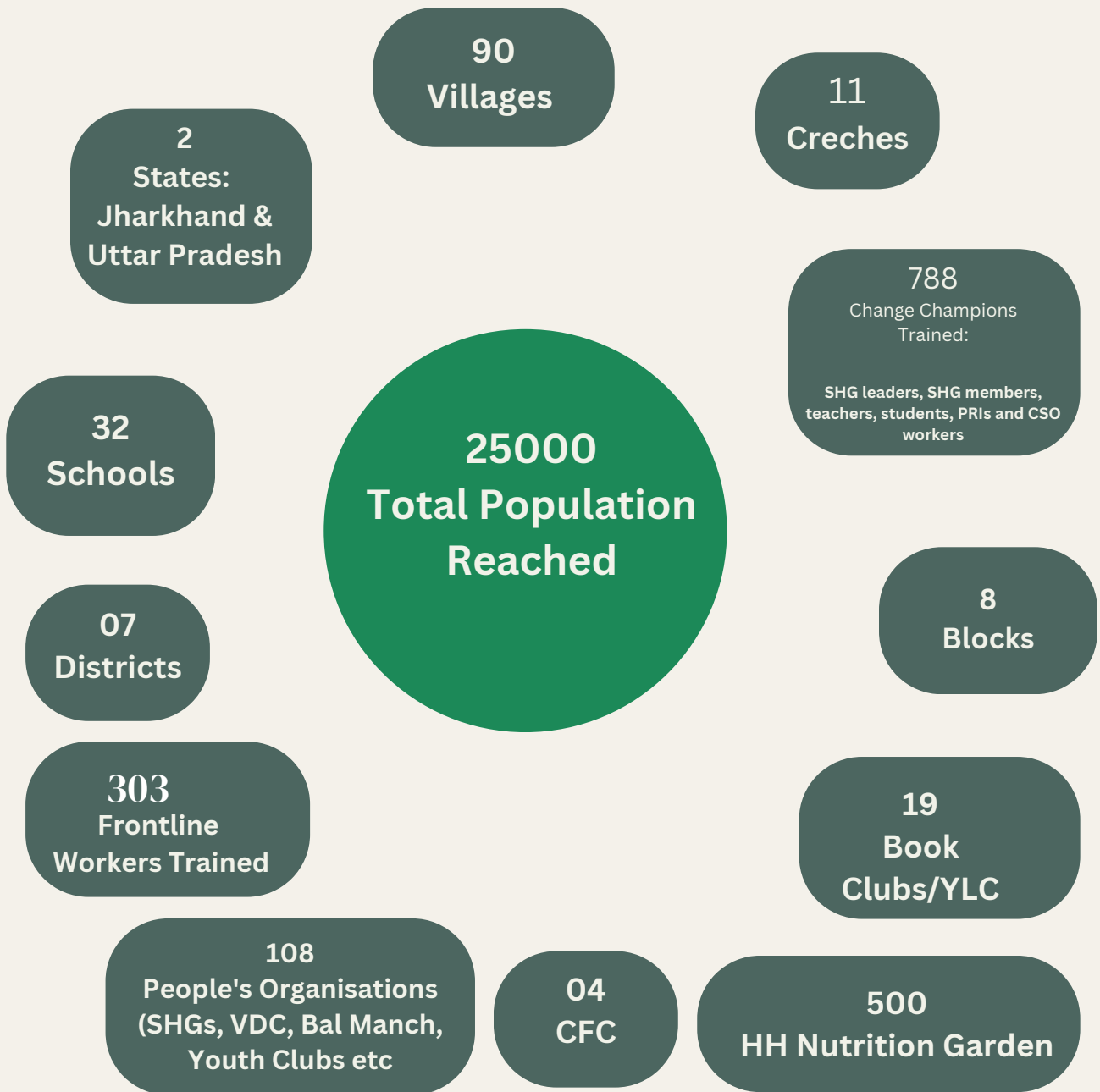

Details of Intervention

survival - securing health, nutrition, and education for children and safeguarding them from the harms of illegal mining in Koderma.

Objectives:

- To provide health services, quality supplementary nutrition, and pre-school education to all children in the age group of 0-5 years.
- To connect children aged 6-14 years and 15-18 years involved in mica mining in Koderma to primary and secondary schools.
- To link underprivileged communities to health, nutrition, education, and government schemes through collaboration with state and district-level government services.

“Under this project, creches (Bal Baagicha) have been established in 11 villages to provide proper nutritional support and care to children from vulnerable communities. These centers are unique to the area, offering a safe and clean environment for children aged 6 months to 3 years. Regular updates on food supplements, height and weight checkups, MUAC measurements, playful activities, and development of healthy habits are conducted. In addition, various other activities are carried out to fulfill the project's objectives, ensuring the well-being and growth of these children.”

Community Empowerment Program

RMI is supporting the Community Empowerment Programme in 10 villages of Koderma, designed to uplift communities in mica-rich areas. The program focuses on five key themes:

1. **Livelihood**
2. **Education**
3. **Social Rights**
4. **Health, Hygiene, and Nutrition**
5. **Advocacy**

Through this initiative, ultra-poor families are being uplifted via various activities, including asset-building assistance, vocational training, financial literacy sessions, distribution of kitchen garden seeds, scholarships, the establishment of educational infrastructure, Community Libraries, Balwadi centers, health and nutritional camps, hygiene awareness programs, and support in accessing social security schemes. These efforts are provided at individual, small-group, and large-group levels to ensure comprehensive community development.

“This initiative plays a crucial role in bringing about comprehensive change in the development of families and children dependent on mica. By addressing key issues in livelihoods, education, health, and social rights, the project aims to create sustainable improvements in the lives of these communities. Additionally, it has successfully drawn the attention of the district administration to the challenges faced by those living in mica mining areas, ensuring that their concerns are recognized and addressed at the local governance level.”

Addressing Trafficking through Effective Prevention and Reintegration

Objective:

- To strengthen systems that prevent and protect children and young people at risk of or affected by unsafe migration, and to assist in the sustainable reintegration of survivors of trafficking and exploitation.
- To establish resource pools at the district level to assist victims of unsafe migration and generate evidence for collective advocacy at the state level.
- To promote safety in reintegration and establish child safeguarding measures in the community and other places.
- To support the mental health, functioning, and psychosocial well-being of trafficking survivors.
- To raise child protection concerns and support referrals through regular meetings with formal and informal child protection stakeholders.
- To increase collective action through theatre, sports, and arts, involving girls, boys, parents, and trafficking survivors, to challenge harmful practices.

“In this project supported by TDH Foundation, we are actively organizing various programs to prevent trafficking by forming groups of girls, adolescents, and boys in our area. Adolescents are leading efforts in collective action and community awareness through drama, theater, sports, and art. The number of children and young people (CYP) involved is growing, and they are becoming more aware of the risks they face. They are also taking a stand against gender-based harmful practices by making public declarations.

Through the use of BECOME tools and equipment, children are now empowered to follow principles that prioritize their best interests. Witnessing this progress brings great satisfaction and fulfillment, knowing that these efforts are making a meaningful difference.”



Digital & Raksha Innovation

The sole objective of this project is to provide a digital solution that empowers young people facing or at risk of sexual abuse to seek support and help. By utilizing technology, the project ensures that vulnerable individuals can access timely assistance and resources in a safe, confidential, and accessible manner.

“This project stands out because, unlike other initiatives, it actively involves youth and adolescents in both the creation and use of the Raksha App. By engaging them in the development process, the project ensures the app meets their needs while empowering them to take an active role in their own safety and well-being. This participatory approach fosters a sense of ownership and increases the app's relevance and effectiveness in supporting young people at risk of sexual abuse.”



Awareness campaign on govt. Policies, programs, and schemes through Nukkad Natak

An awareness campaign on government policies, programs, and schemes is being conducted through Nukkad Natak (street theater) and seminars/symposiums. These activities aim to educate and inform the community, especially marginalized groups, about the various government initiatives available to them. Nukkad Natak serves as an engaging and interactive way to spread awareness, while seminars and symposiums provide a platform for in-depth discussions and knowledge sharing. This approach ensures that vital information reaches a wide audience in an accessible and impactful manner.

Area of Intervention:

Koderma, Chatra, Hazaribagh & Saraykela-Kharsawan, Giridih, and Lohardaga District of Jharkhand

“Due to a lack of awareness, many people in both urban and rural areas of Jharkhand are unable to access government schemes. In response, our organization has formed two Nukkad Natak teams that actively organize street theater (Nukkad Natak), songs and music (Geet-Sangeet), seminars, and symposiums to inform communities about government development schemes. These teams visit villages, raise awareness about various government programs, and also address issues like blind faith and social evils through Lokgeet, mimicry, and Nukkad Natak performances. This engaging and culturally relevant approach has proven to be very effective in reaching the community and generating positive results.”



Livelihood & Enterprise Development Program (LEDP)

The Livelihood & Enterprise Development Program (LEDP) focuses on enhancing the economic well-being of communities by providing support for sustainable livelihoods and enterprise development. The program aims to empower individuals and communities, particularly those from vulnerable and marginalized groups, by offering training, resources, and opportunities to start or strengthen small businesses. Through skill development, financial literacy, access to markets, and capacity-building, LEDP works to create long-term economic independence and improve the overall standard of living. The program also promotes entrepreneurship and innovation, helping participants build resilient and sustainable livelihoods.

Area of Intervention

Three Panchayats (Naitand, Beko & Dandadih of Jainagar Block of Koderma District)

“With the support of NABARD, SHG (Self-Help Group) members initially received training on livelihood generation. As a result, today, all the members are engaged in vegetable cultivation as a source of livelihood. Additionally, in Dandadih, women's groups are cultivating madua (a type of millet) and running businesses that produce various dishes and products made from madua. This initiative has not only enhanced the economic independence of these women but also contributed to sustainable livelihoods within the community.”



Swadhar Greh

Swadhar Greh is a government initiative aimed at providing shelter, support, and rehabilitation to women in difficult circumstances, such as those who are homeless, destitute, or facing abuse. The program provides a safe space for women, offering essential services like food, clothing, medical care, legal aid, and counseling. The goal of Swadhar Greh is to help these women reintegrate into society by providing them with the necessary resources, skills, and support to lead a dignified life. The program also focuses on empowering women through vocational training, educational opportunities, and emotional support to rebuild their lives and gain independence.

“Samarpan is successfully running a Swadhar Greh in Hazaribagh with the support of the Women and Child Development department. The center provides institutional assistance for the rehabilitation of women who have faced difficult circumstances, helping them lead lives with dignity. Under this scheme, the women receive essential services such as shelter, food, clothing, and healthcare, as well as economic and social security. The program aims to empower these women by providing them with the support they need to rebuild their lives and achieve greater independence and self-sufficiency.”

Objectives of Swadhar Greh:

- To provide shelter, food, clothing, and healthcare to women who are victims of difficult circumstances, ensuring their immediate safety and well-being.
- To offer rehabilitation and counseling services to help women rebuild their lives with dignity and self-respect.
- To empower women through skills development, vocational training, and educational opportunities to enable economic independence.
- To provide social security and legal aid, ensuring women have access to their rights and are protected from exploitation and abuse.
- To foster an environment that promotes emotional healing, personal growth, and reintegration into society, helping women regain confidence and stability.



Ujjawala Home

The Ujjawala Home is a government initiative aimed at the rescue, rehabilitation, and reintegration of women and children who are victims of trafficking and sexual exploitation. The program provides shelter and support services to survivors, including legal aid, psychological counseling, medical care, and vocational training.

The primary objective of the Ujjawala Home is to ensure the safety and dignity of the survivors, helping them recover from trauma and empowering them to rebuild their lives. Additionally, it works towards reintegrating the survivors into society by providing them with the skills and resources needed for social and economic independence. The program also focuses on raising awareness about human trafficking and the prevention of exploitation.

Under the Ujjawala Scheme in Hazaribagh, trafficked women and girls who have been rescued or have escaped from brothels or other exploitative situations, as well as women affected by HIV/AIDS without social or economic support, are provided with essential assistance. The scheme offers these women and girls shelter, legal aid, medical care, psychological counseling, and vocational training. Additionally, the program works towards reintegrating them into society, ensuring they receive the necessary resources to lead dignified lives and regain economic independence. Ujjawala aims to protect, rehabilitate, and empower these vulnerable women and girls.

There is a significant need for homes like Ujjawala in Jharkhand, as the number of women and girls facing various forms of exploitation is rising. This includes victims of domestic violence, girls trapped in love affairs, and women who fall victim to trafficking. These vulnerable individuals often find themselves in dire situations, and providing them with proper security, shelter, and rehabilitation services brings hope and empowerment. Witnessing the positive impact of these services on women and adolescents fills the heart with joy, as it helps restore their dignity and offers them a chance at a better life.



Women Health & Livelihood Initiative

Goal: The goal of this project is to empower rural communities in 5 villages of Chandauli, with a special focus on women and adolescent girls. It aims to improve their livelihood opportunities while also providing preventive and curative healthcare services, ensuring a holistic approach to their well-being. The project strives to enhance economic independence, health awareness, and access to essential healthcare, contributing to the overall development and empowerment of women and girls in these communities.

Project Aims & Objectives:

The project aims to create awareness and bring about behavior change regarding reproductive health issues among 2000 women and adolescent girls in the selected area. The primary objective is to initiate and implement capacity-building interventions in the region.

Objectives:

- To provide preventive healthcare to 2000 women and adolescent girls on reproductive health issues, promoting improved health behaviors and practices.
- To offer curative health services to address infections and other health concerns among the beneficiaries.
- To create an enabling environment for health-seeking behavior through various awareness campaigns and drives targeting both direct and indirect beneficiaries.
- To improve the livelihood status of 35 women entrepreneurs through sustainable farm and non-farm interventions, aiming to increase their income by up to Rs 1500.

For the first time, we were given the opportunity to extend our work beyond our home state, reaching out to the villages of Uttar Pradesh, specifically in the Niyamatabad block of Chandauli district. This valuable opportunity was made possible by the Welspun Foundation. With their support, we have been able to promote health and livelihood initiatives in five villages of the region.

This work stands out for several reasons and has proven to be a model that could be replicated in other areas. Successfully completing all activities on time and witnessing the growing awareness among the people is truly rewarding. Our team performed exceptionally well in this new region, establishing a strong identity. Beyond just the five villages, we have also built a positive reputation in various health centers, sub-centers, block offices, as well as with NABARD, DM, LDM, and RSETI offices. This has significantly enhanced our presence and impact in the area.

EMPOWERING THE COMMUNITY (WOMEN & YOUTH) WITH ENTITLEMENTS AND TO PROMOTE LOCAL GOVERNANCE

Improving the socio-economic conditions of deprived, vulnerable, and marginalized communities is a challenging task for any social organization. Empowering these communities by ensuring access to their rights and entitlements and linking them with various government schemes is a priority for every citizen, social organization, and the community itself. Promoting local governance and providing continuous support to the community throughout the year presents a wonderful yet challenging learning opportunity for both our organization and our team members.

This opportunity has been made possible through the Azim Premji Foundation. This marks the first year of the project, where our focus will be on laying the foundation for community empowerment. We aim to achieve this through awareness-building, skill development, and fostering the right attitudes, along with engaging in social, cultural, economic, emotional, and educational activities. These efforts will help build the capacity of the community and set the stage for sustainable growth and empowerment.

Gram Sabha

Gram Sabhas play a crucial role in promoting active citizen participation, fostering transparency, and integrating traditional knowledge into the decision-making process. By strengthening these forums, we enhance local self-governance and help build resilient, self-reliant communities. The Gram Sabha serves as the foundation of local governance, bringing together all eligible voters of a village in a general assembly. These meetings, typically held once or twice a year, provide a platform for discussing and making decisions on matters related to local development, welfare, and administration. Through the Gram Sabha, villagers can voice their opinions, raise concerns, and collectively take decisions that shape the future of their community.

- 1. Promote Early Childhood Development:** To foster the cognitive, emotional, and social development of children aged 0-6 years through structured pre-school education.
- 2. Ensure Nutritional Support:** To provide balanced, nutritious meals to children in pre-schools, aiming to improve their overall health, growth, and development.
- 3. Prepare Children for Formal Education:** To equip young children with foundational skills and knowledge that will ease their transition to primary school, ensuring they are school-ready.
- 4. Raise Awareness on Health and Hygiene:** To educate children and their families about the importance of proper hygiene and health practices, contributing to a healthier community.
- 5. Address Malnutrition:** To combat malnutrition among pre-school children by providing regular nutritional monitoring, supplements, and health interventions where necessary.
- 6. Support Vulnerable Communities:** To ensure that children from marginalized and vulnerable communities receive equal access to early education and nutrition.
- 7. Involve Parents and the Community:** To engage parents and community members in the development of children's early education and nutritional health, fostering a supportive learning environment.

“For the childhood development of 75 children in two Birhor Tolas of Koderma, a comprehensive approach is being taken. In addition to pre-school education, special attention is given to their cognitive, emotional, and social development. To support their nutritional needs, milk and biscuits are provided regularly. Efforts are also being made to connect these children with various government facilities and services, ensuring they receive holistic support for their growth and well-being.”



Child Care Institutions (CCI)

Objective

1. **Provide a Safe and Secure Environment:** To ensure children in need of care and protection are placed in a safe, secure, and nurturing environment, free from abuse, neglect, or exploitation.
2. **Promote Holistic Development:** To support the physical, emotional, intellectual, and social development of children by providing education, healthcare, counseling, and recreational activities.
3. **Rehabilitation and Reintegration:** To facilitate the rehabilitation and reintegration of children back into society, including reuniting them with their families or providing alternative family care, such as foster care or adoption.
4. **Ensure Access to Basic Needs:** To provide children with food, shelter, clothing, and medical care, ensuring their basic needs are met in a dignified manner.
5. **Support Mental Health and Well-being:** To offer psychological support and counseling services to address the trauma or emotional challenges children may face, promoting their mental health and well-being.
6. **Uphold Child Rights:** To protect and promote the rights of children in accordance with national and international child protection laws and guidelines.
7. **Build Life Skills and Education:** To equip children with education and life skills that will prepare them for independent living and responsible adulthood.
8. **Prevent Exploitation and Trafficking:** To protect children from exploitation, trafficking, and other forms of harm, ensuring they grow up in a safe and supportive environment.

With the support of the Jharkhand government, Samarpan NGO is operating a Child Care Institution (CCI) in Lohardaga district. The objective of this institution is to provide a safe environment for orphaned, vulnerable, and distressed children, where they receive education, healthcare services, emotional and mental support, as well as nutritious meals. The organization is also working towards the rehabilitation and reintegration of these children into society so they can live a dignified and secure life.
